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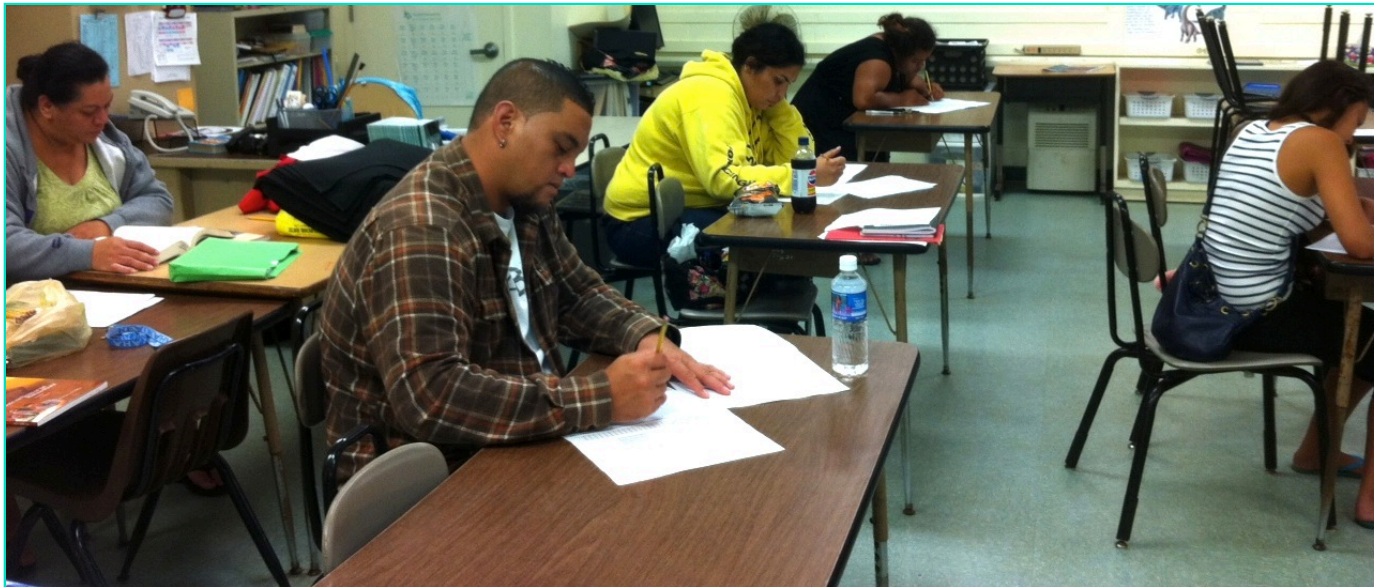

## Pane'e Mua Project

The Pane'e Mua Project (PMP) was created to serve the educational needs of Native Hawaiian adults (18+) in East Hawai'i. In addition to the free Community Learning Programs, the Pane'e Mua Project also provides free High School diploma classes with adult education programs focusing on job skills, life skills, and Hawaiian culture. In partnership with the State of Hawai'i Department of Education's Community School for Adult Education in Hilo, the Pane'e Mua Project is able to provide all levels of High School Diploma instruction including GED and Competency Based courses.

Pane'e Mua means to progress along one move at a time thus the Pane'e Mua Project strives to help our students to achieve their goals at their own pace in a supportive learning environment. We also include required supplementary course instruction in job skills, life skills, and Hawaiian culture, building confidence and self-knowledge while preparing our students for success in future opportunities.

To receive services from the Pane'e Mua Project, you must be:

- 18 years or older;
- reside in East Hawai'i;
- and be of Native Hawaiian ancestry.

## About Native Nations Education Foundation

Native Nations Education Foundation (NNEF) was founded in 2002 as a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization. We are committed to creating and supporting diverse educational opportunities for Native Hawaiians. Since 2004, NNEF has served over 2,000 Native Hawaiians through our Community Learning, High School Diploma, Math and Science Curriculum and Mentoring programs. In 2008, we moved our base of operations from O'ahu to East Hawai'i, now serving Hilo, Puna, and a portion of the Hāmākua district. In 2010, NNEF was awarded a 3 year grant from the Administration for Native Americans (ANA) to implement the Pane'e Mua Project (PMP) with the purpose of providing free High School Diploma courses and free community learning opportunities that addresses interests in job skills, life skills, and Hawaiian culture to East Hawai'i's Native Hawaiian adult population (18+).
